#### From the Pastor

"As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."

Genesis 8:22

When I was a child, I remember my mom used to say she wanted to put a brick on my head so I'd stop growing up so fast. That sounded pretty silly to me because I wanted nothing more than to grow up — as quickly as possible. But I understood when Linda and I had a family of our own and our daughters seemed to go straight from kindergarten to adulthood. Even when you take time to enjoy and appreciate every moment, eventually you look back on entire decades and they each seem to have taken no longer than a month to pass.

Now, working among you at Hilltop Church as your pastor, I'm starting to feel like I want to put a brick on the head of each passing month and year. It seems like just yesterday that we announced we'd be sharing Wednesday noon Lenten services and lunches with the other churches in town. I kicked it off with an Ash Wednesday service at Grace Lutheran. Now, a mere moment later, the Easter season and Pentecost have past, and our summer of Ordinary Time is upon us. We'd better start planning for Advent because, at this rate, it will be here any day now! It also seems like just yesterday that we implemented the Quest after school program but, as I write, the school year is drawing to a close.

With such an unrelenting calendar, it's easy to look back and wonder, "Did we proclaim the resurrection of Christ sufficiently, before moving on to other things? Was the message of salvation and grace clear and powerful enough to last a whole year?" It's an easy trap to fall into. But, the Good News is that we really never do move on to other things! Christ's perfect actions on the cross and beyond are all we need to save us forever! We celebrate every Sunday as the Lord's Day "because the gospels testify that Jesus rose from the dead early on the first day of the week... While we may worship God on any day and at any time, the Sunday service in particular is a celebration of Christ's resurrection and an anticipation of the fullness of God's coming reign" (Book of Order, W-3.0101).

As Easter recedes into the past; as the church colors change from white, then to red, and now to green; as the pages of our calendars turn and turn again; and as leaves bud, turn green, then orange and red before they dry and fall: Know that Good News of the grace and salvation of Jesus Christ does not come and go with a date on the calendar. It is constant and unwavering, forever. The gospel message and the work of the Holy Spirit are as fresh and powerful today as on that Jerusalem morning when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples with a rush of wind and tongues of fire.

So, I will not be pumping the brakes trying to slow down a year that's not mine to control anyway. Keep your seatbelts on. In Christ, we are moving full speed ahead. Thanks be to God!

# Eye on Stewardship From The Finance & Stewardship Area of Ministry


Presented below are financial results for the first ten months of this fiscal year as compared to the prior two years. As we reported in the last issue of the Spire, we continue to "hold our own." Our cash position remains solid and there are no borrowings under the PGB link of credit. Total contributions are up year-over-year, driven in part by strong pledge income. Our staff continues to keep a close eye on expenses. However, unanticipated (but necessary) costs related to the upkeep of our church have been a drag on overall expenses. As a result, we ended the period with a net loss of \$16k. We encourage all members to keep current on their pledge over the summer months.

#### 2023 FISCHER SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Two of Hilltop's fabulous graduating high school Seniors were recognized on May 21st. Elizabeth Fox and Daniel Lowe were awarded the 2023 Fischer Scholarships. The scholarship was established in 1996 by an endowment from Herb and Wilma Fischer. The intent is to recognize graduating members of Hilltop Church who have demonstrated a superior commitment to the church and its programs.

Elizabeth Fox has been involved in a variety of Hilltop activities, from making hoagies and leading the Souper Bowl of Caring, to performing and assisting with the Christmas pageant. She has supported Mission events at the Interfaith Food Pantry and contributed to Christian Education as a Sunday School teacher. During Covid, Elizabeth found ways to continue to serve: organizing food drives and fundraisers. In



her application, Elizabeth credits the active service and other programs at Hilltop as inspiration: "Seeing the eagerness of Hilltop's members to share their time, talent, and treasures in any way possible has created an environment where I am excited to be an active part of the community... Hilltop has always fostered my faith and servitude."

Daniel Lowe has been active in many of the Christian Education and Mission programs with Hilltop Church, but his commitment to 2 particular activities stands out. He volunteered with the Robotics program at Homeless Solutions, meeting most Saturday mornings to work one-on-one with the HSI children as they learned to design, build and program their robot. Daniel also led the Snow Angels program for the last 2 years, including organizing, promoting and recruiting volunteers. A quote from his essay resonated with the Committee: "At the time, I was unsure of what good I was doing, but looking back on the experience, I realize that putting time and effort in could make a difference for someone else."

Both Daniel and Elizabeth have shared their talents with the youth and adults of Hilltop Church, thus growing and witnessing their faith. We have appreciated and enjoyed their leadership and know they will carry their Christian spirit and commitment to serving others through college. Congratulations Daniel and Elizabeth!

Cathy Malman taught this year's CBW class. We had seven students in CBW


